Senior French Honors Thesis

Majors in French who have maintained a G.P.A. of 3.5 overall and in the major, and have completed at least two quarters as juniors, qualify to pursue a senior thesis. Those who successfully complete this project (with a grade of A- or higher) will graduate with honors; their diplomas and transcripts will read "Distinction in the Major."

Specific guidelines for completing the Honors Thesis are outlined below.

- 1. To participate in this program, you should seek the guidance of a faculty member as soon as possible to serve as your Thesis Advisor. We strongly encourage you to start in the fall quarter of your senior year to find a faculty member. Any Affiliate ladder faculty member or continuing/visiting lecturer is an acceptable Thesis Advisor. If you want to do a thesis under the supervision of a faculty member outside of the department, fill out the thesis proposal and submit it to the Undergrad Advisor for French. The Chair of the Program will notify you if a co-supervisor is required.
- 2. Please fill out the attached form, and write a statement of purpose, with a tentative title and the texts you plan to read, describe briefly the topic to be studied, and, if available, attach a list of primary and secondary sources. Please submit a written proposal to the professor whom you would like to supervise your thesis. Send your proposal, signed by the proposed Thesis Advisor, to the French Undergraduate Advisor at least two quarters before the quarter in which you will complete your thesis, even if you are not registered for that quarter or you are abroad.
- 3. Once he/she has agreed to supervise your work in French literature and/or French interdisciplinary studies, please enroll in a French 195H (or FR 199 if necessary) with this professor (for a maximum of 4 units). You will receive this add code from the Undergrad Advisor for French. The total amount of academic credit that can be earned for a thesis may not exceed 8 units. Note that one unit corresponds to 3 hours of work per week in a 10 week quarter. You can enroll in only 1 quarter (FR 195H) or 2 quarters, with one quarter being a prep quarter (FR 199) and then the final quarter (FR 195H), although a prep quarter is not necessary. FR 195H will be completed additional to the major.
- 4. You will then begin preparing a Senior Honors Essay, an in-depth research paper, which should be at least 20 pages long and in French (double spaced).
- 5. You must submit one copy of your final thesis as a pdf document to the French Undergraduate Advisor. It should be formatted as a double-spaced document and according to the format of graduate theses, using MLA format for citation (see sample at: http://graddiv.ucsb.edu/handbook/filingguide.aspx).
- 6. Your thesis must be signed by your Thesis Advisor (see #4 below for the right format).

The Hermione Chevallier Prize

Senior honors students who complete their projects by mid-May may submit their essays for consideration for the Hermione Chevallier Prize, a special recognition awarded annually to the best Honors essay dealing with French and/or Francophone topics in language, literature and culture. The Prize comes with a modest cash award. It is awarded at the annual Pi Delta Phi reception every Spring.
